

TRAFFIC ORDER PROPOSALS – PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND DISABLED PARKING SPACE ON SCHOOL ROAD, GRAYSHOTT

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Hampshire County Council (“the Council”) proposes to make the above-mentioned Order, in exercise of its powers and duties under Sections 1, 2, 4, 5, 32, 35, 39 and 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”), Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act, and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act and having discharged its duty under section 122 of the Act.

GENERAL NATURE AND EFFECTS OF THE ORDER: Will be to implement prohibition of waiting restrictions on School Road as described below:

- (i) North-east side - Between a point 45 metres north-east of its junction with Beech Lane and a point 23 metres north-east of that point.
- (ii) East side - between a point 10 metres north of its junction with Beech Lane and a point 18 metres south of that junction
- (iii) East side - between a point 10 metres north of its junction with Beech Hanger Road and a point 20 metres south of that junction.
- (iv) East side - between its junction with Headley Road and a point 23 metres north of that junction.
- (v) East side - between a point 75 metres north of its junction with Headley Road and a point 56 metres north of that point.
- (vi) East side – between a point 75 metres north of its junction with Headley Road and a point 28 metres south of that point.
- (vii) East side - between a point 150 metres north of its junction with Headley Road and a point 61 metres north of that point.

This order will also formalise the existing disabled bay on School Road’s east side east side between a point 211 metres north of its junction with Headley Road and a point 6 metres north east of that point.

This order will revoke and reinstate ‘The Hampshire (Various Roads, Grayshott) (Parking Places and Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2013’, ‘The Hampshire (Various Roads, Grayshott) (Parking Places and Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2013 (Variation No. 1) Order 2014’, ‘East Hampshire District Council (Grayshott: Crossways Road and Headley Road) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) and (Disabled Badge Holders Only Parking) Order 2018’, and ‘East Hampshire District Council (Grayshott: Avenue Road, Crossways Road and Headley Road) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 2020’ with no change of substance, save for the changes above.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE HAMPSHIRE (VARIOUS ROADS, GRAYSHOTT) (LOADING, PARKING PLACES, DISABLED PERSONS PARKING PLACES & PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2026

Hampshire County Council in exercise of its powers and duties under Sections 1, 2, 4, 5, 32, 35, 39 and 122 of the Act, and of all other enabling powers, Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following order:

PART I – GENERAL

1. In this order, and the preamble and schedules hereto:
 - “the Act” means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
 - “the Council” means Hampshire County Council;
 - “Carriageway” means a way constituting or comprised in a highway being a way (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of Vehicles;
 - “disabled person’s badge” has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;
 - “driver” in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;
 - “enactment”, “local service”, “public service vehicle”, “telecommunications apparatus”, “goods vehicle”, “taxi” and “taxi rank” have the same meaning as in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016;
 - “pedal cycle” means a unicycle, bicycle, tricycle or a cycle having four or more wheels, not being in any case mechanically propelled unless it is an electrically assisted pedal cycle that is not treated as a motor vehicle for the purposes of the 1984 Act;
 - “heavy commercial vehicle” has the same meaning as in Section 138(1) of the Act;
 - “motor vehicle”, “motor car”, “motor cycle” and “invalid carriage” have the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
 - “parking disc” means a disc, issued by a Local Authority, 125 millimetres square, coloured orange or blue and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;
 - “parking place” means any part of a road authorised by this order to be used as a parking place; and
 - “road” means any length of highway or any other length of road to which the public has access and includes bridges over which a road may pass.
2. Regulation 4 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 has effect for the purpose of defining the expression “relevant position” in this order.
3. In the event of any dispute as to the meaning of any heading or legend used in any part of this order, any schedule to this order or any plan attached to this order, the substantive wording in the order or schedule shall prevail over the heading or legend. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this order shall be in addition to and not

in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

PART II – AUTHORISATION AND USE OF PARKING PLACES

4. (i) Subject to the following provisions of this order, each of the parts of a road specified in schedule I to this order is authorised to be used as a parking place for such classes of vehicles, on such days, during such hours and for such maximum periods as are specified in the said schedule in relation to that part of the road.
(ii) Nothing in paragraph (i) of this article shall restrict the power of the Council to close any parking place.
5. Where in schedule I to this order a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class, the driver of the vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place:
 - (a) unless it is of the specified class; and
 - (b) unless it is positioned within the parking areas defined by white lines on the surface of the road and the distance between the edge of the carriageway and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than fifty centimetres.
6. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place:
 - (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons, or so as to be a nuisance;
 - (b) when the Council has closed that parking place.
7. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.
8. No person shall use a vehicle, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.
9. A vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge shall be exempt from any limitation on time specified in column 5 of part 1 of schedule I to this order.
10. Subject to the proviso hereto, when a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in article 4, article 5 or article 6 of this order a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place; provided that when a vehicle is waiting in a parking place in contravention of the provision of article 5(b) of this order, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with that provision.
11. Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of the last preceding article of this order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the

vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its position, as the case may be.

12. When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of article 10 of this order, he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

PART IV – PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND LOADING

13. Save as provided in articles 15 and 16 of this order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait:
 - (i) at any time on any side of road specified in schedule II to this order.
 - (ii) between the hours of 7.00am to 9.00am and 7.00pm to 9.00pm on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule III to this Order unless it is a goods vehicle loading or unloading.
 - (iii) between the hours of 8.00am and 6.00pm from Monday to Saturday (both days inclusive) on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule IV to this Order for a longer period than 2 hours or if a period of less than 2 hours has elapsed since the termination, during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) by the same vehicle on the same side of road.
 - (iv) between the hours of 9.00am and 6.00pm from Monday to Saturday (both days inclusive) on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule V to this Order for a longer period than 2 hours or if a period of less than 2 hours has elapsed since the termination, during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) by the same vehicle on the same side of road.
14. Save as provided in article 17, no person shall, except upon the direction of the or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to load/unload goods to or from the vehicle on any side of road:
 - (i) at any time as specified in Schedule II to this order.
 - (ii) during the prohibited hours as specified is Schedules IV & V
15. Nothing in article 13 of this order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any side of road referred to in that article for so long as may be necessary:
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the following operations namely:
 - (i) building or demolition;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said side of road;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said side of road, of any sewer, of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus;

- (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority, the Environment Agency or a water or sewerage undertaker within the meaning of the Water Act 1989 in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said sides of road;
 - (f) to enable a public service vehicle being used in the operation of a local service to wait at any authorised stopping place for the purpose of:
 - (i) allowing a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to pay a fare, or
 - (ii) allowing the vehicle to wait, if it arrives at the stopping place in advance of the advertised time for a period not exceeding 2 minutes;
 - (g) to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a licensed universal postal service provider for the purpose of sorting, delivering or collecting postal packets in the course of the provision of a universal postal service as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000;
 - (h) to enable the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said side of road for so long as is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral;
 - (i) to enable the vehicle to be used for fire and rescue service, ambulance or police purposes; or
 - (j) to enable the vehicle to be used by a registered medical practitioner, midwife or district nurse in the course of his or her professional duties.
16. Nothing in article 13 of this order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and, if appropriate, a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on any side of road referred to in that article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same road on the same day).
17. Nothing in article 14 of this order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the sides of road referred to in that article for so long as may be necessary:
- (a) to enable the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the following operations, namely:
 - (i) building or demolition;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of road;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said sides of road, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or telecommunications apparatus;
 - (b) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (c) to enable the vehicle to be used for fire and rescue service, ambulance or police purposes.

18. Subject to the proviso hereto, when a vehicle is left on any side of road as referenced in article 13 or 14 in contravention of the provisions in those articles, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place; provided that when a vehicle is waiting in a parking place in contravention of the provision of article 13 of this order, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with that provision.
19. Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of the last preceding article of this order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its position, as the case may be.
20. When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of article 19 of this order, he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.
21. In the event of any dispute as to the meaning of any heading or legend used in any part of this order, any schedule to this order or any plan attached to this order, the substantive wording in the order or schedule shall prevail over the heading or legend. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

PART V - REVOCATIONS

22. The following orders are hereby revoked in their entirety:
 - (i) The Hampshire (Various Roads, Grayshott) (Parking Places and Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2013
 - (ii) The Hampshire (Various Roads, Grayshott) (Parking Places and Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2013 (Variation No. 1) Order 2014
 - (iii) East Hampshire District Council (Grayshott: Crossways Road and Headley Road) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) and (Disabled Badge Holders Only Parking) Order 2018
 - (iv) East Hampshire District Council (Grayshott: Avenue Road, Crossways Road and Headley Road) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 2020
23. This order shall come into force on the _____ 2026 and may be cited as “The Hampshire (Various Roads, Grayshott) (Loading, Parking Places, Disabled Persons Parking Places & Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 2026”.

Statement of Reasons

School Road

Grayshott CE Primary School is situated on School Road in Grayshott.

Within the age range of 4-11, pupils in the Grayshott area walk to this school using the intended footways and crossing points navigating down School Road to reach their destination.

To assist safer crossing on School Road, there is an existing dropped kerb in place to access the school easier, which is alongside a barrier. There is only a footway on the south west side of the road.

After recent review, it has been conducted that further restrictions of parking would remove parked vehicles to increase the visibility of the road when crossing ensuring it would be safer for the children to cross and would also increase the safety of cyclists heading towards/ away from Grayshott CE Primary School. It has also been conducted to legalise the existing disabled bay to allow those with a disability easier access to the disabled bay including the periods of school pickups and drop offs which may also be needed for pupils who might not be able to walk far to the school.

Beech Hanger Road

It is proposed to refresh the existing give way and double yellow line markings on the junction to School Road as the visibility seems to be unclear on the road currently causing confusion on the junction.

By refreshing the existing markings can give a clear visibility and to keep the junction clear at all times to allow residents coming from Beech Hanger Road or school children to cross safely.

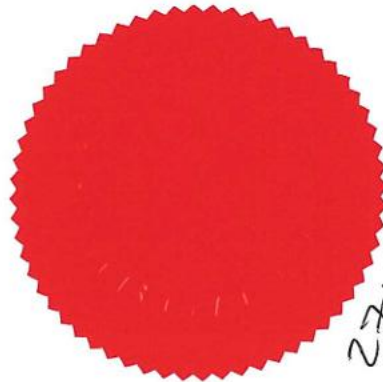

Hampshire County Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4, 32, 35 and 36 of the Act, Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following order:

PART 1 – GENERAL

1. In this order, and the preamble and schedules hereto :

“the Act” means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

“the Council” means Hampshire County Council or East Hampshire District Council, acting as agents;

“disabled person’s badge” and “disabled person’s vehicle” have the same meaning as in the Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

“driver” in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

“goods vehicle” means a motor vehicle or trailer constructed or adapted for use for the carriage or haulage of goods or burden of any description;

“motor vehicle”, “motor car”, “motor cycle” and “invalid carriage” have the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

“parking disc” means a disc, issued by a Local Authority, 125 millimetres square, coloured orange or blue and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;

“parking place” means any part of a road authorised by this order to be used as a parking place; and

“road” means any length of highway or any other length of road to which the public has access, and includes bridges over which a road passes.

2. Regulation 4 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 has effect for the purpose of defining the expression “relevant position” in this order.

3. In the event of any dispute as to the meaning of any heading or legend used in any part of this order, any schedule to this order or any plan attached to this order, the substantive wording in the order or schedule shall prevail over the heading or legend. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

PART II – AUTHORISATION AND USE OF PARKING PLACES

4. (i) Subject to the following provisions of this order, the part of road specified in schedule I to this order is authorised to be used as a parking place for such
